EIGHT MONKS FROM DREPUNG LOSELING MONASTERY IN INDIA VISITED RUTGERS-CAMDEN TO CREATE A SACRED MANDALA IMAGE THAT REPRE-SENTED THE IMPERMANENCE OF LIFE. THE CEREMONY OPENED WITH THE POUNDING OF DRUMS, A LOUD BLAST OF TRUMPETS, THE CHIME OF CYMBALS, AND THE CHANT-ING OF MANTRAS. AFTER OUTLINING THE DESIGN ON A WOODEN MONKS EACH HELD A METAL FUNNEL A CHAK-PUR WHILE RUNNING A CALLED

LIQUID INTO PATTERNS. IMAGE TOOK FOUR DAYS, BUT WHEN IT WAS DONE, THE MONKS SWEPT THE SAND INTO AN URN AND MARCHED TO WIGGINS PARK. AFTER DISTRIBUTING AMONG OBSERVERS, THE MONKS POURED RIVER SO WATERS CARRY THE MANDALA'S BLESSING THROUGHOUT WORLD.
